TWO MW's for the L&B

The 762 Club is to construct not one, but two Manning, Wardle locomotives to run on the L&B. These will be 'YEO' and 'EXE'. The company name 'Manning Wardle' is now owned by the L&BR Trust, consequently these two locomotives will be works numbers 2048 and 2049. They will not be 'replicas' but simply new locomotives. The design will be closely based on that of 'LYD', built in the 19th century. The plan is for 'YEO' is to be built in North Derbyshire and 'EXE' at Boston Lodge(Ffestiniog Railway). Tees Valley Combined Authority (TVCA) is seeking a masterplanner for a new 8.3ha heritage railway attraction in Darlington (www.architectsjournal.co.uk)

The Railway Heritage Quarter project, backed by Darlington Borough Council (DBC), will focus on the innovative Stockton and Darlington Railway, the world's first public steam locomotive railway line, which opened to passengers and freight in 1825.

The Railway Heritage Quarter project, backed by Darlington Borough Council, will bring together a former carriageworks, goods shed, engine shed, lime cells and the North Road Station and Head of Steam museum to create a regional destination expected to receive more than 250,000 visitors every year.
